New Compass+ Security Feature: Multi-Factor Authentication

On <u>Thurs 3rd March</u> the Digital team will roll-out a new security feature for Compass+ users. Multi-Factor Authentication (MFA) is an industry standard security enhancement that will further defend Compass+ accounts against hacking attempts. This replaces the requirement where all Compass+ users were automatically prompted to update their password after 90 days. This process should make us more secure and place fewer demands on our Careers Leaders.






South London Labour Market Intelligence

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


British Science Week: 11th- 20th March
